- There was another successful Trail Count done in September at Fino Field and at Louisa Lake. The counts done in July and September tallied close to 1,000 people a day.
- On September 13 she and Dave Cassinelli went to Leominster for a meeting hosted by the Massachusetts Central Rail Trail Organization. The idea is to create improved communication for all of the trail projects in Massachusetts.

- On September 10th Alternatives hosted a celebration in Worcester that included the presentation of the Community Bridging Award to the Friends in recognition of our efforts to give all people a chance to get involved in community activities. Pat displayed the award to the group.

## **Committee Reports**

Maintenance and Enhancement - Dave Cassinelli

- 3 Adopt a Trail Sponsor signs have been installed for Alternatives, Midtown, and the Masons. We are still waiting for organization's to provide art work.
- We need to develop a plan to get more Adopt a Trail Sponsors
- Annual Fall Clean up Day Nov 15<sup>th</sup> from 9-12am. Motion was made & approved for up to \$250 to cover the cost of supplies & advertising. Gas powered weed whackers, edge trimmers & backpack blowers specifically needed to regain 2-4 inches of trail from

encroaching growth along the edges. If not maintained, this will begin to erode the asphalt edges of the trail.

Sheldon presented a plan for stenciling mile markers. Someone has very generously offered to do this at no cost to us. Basically the trail would have
3 different designations: one from the commuter parking lot, and one from the Dunkin Donuts entrance to "ground zero" where these two sections intersect with the main trail. They would be A, B and C with mileage noted at ¼ mile increments. For example, in an emergency the caller could say they are at "A1/2". We would need to be sure the Police and Fire personnel had master maps, and one would be posted on the kiosk. It was decided that white paint should be used and the stenciling should be done on the right hand side. Sheldon was going to present the information to Reno for final approval.

Education and Activities – Christine Haslam and Linda Konvalinka

- In Christine's absence Pat read her thanks to all for helping with the Health Fair booth.
- She is investigating aquatic weed watcher's program
- On October 14th there will be a Full Moon Hike (rain date October 15)
- On October 18th there will be a geocache "lesson"
- Julie presented an idea to have a Halloween activity on October 26. She will work with Christine and Linda. Dave agreed to follow up with Mike Shain on the annual Pumpkin Stroll date to avoid a potential conflict.
